IMPORTANT DATES

Aug. 11, 2023	Voter Information Pamphlets start going out to registered voters residing in Trustee Area One.
Aug. 20, 2023	Ballots begin to go out to registered voters residing in Trustee Area One. <i>*This is a vote by mail election only, there will be no vote centers.</i>
Aug. 21, 2023	In-office voting begins at the Registrar of Voters office (Monday – Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.) <i>*The Registrar's office will be closed weekends and on Sept. 4 in observance of Labor Day.</i>
Aug. 22, 2023	Two official ballot drop box locations available through Election Day, Sept. 19. A list of locations can be found on the Election Information page at sdvote.com.
Sept. 5, 2023	Deadline to register to vote.
Sept. 6 to Sept. 19, 2023	Conditional Voter Registration period. If you missed the registration deadline, you can still conditionally register and vote provisionally at the Registrar's office.
Sept. 19, 2023	Last day to vote! The Registrar's office and two ballot drop boxes are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.
Sept. 26, 2023	Last day for Registrar's office to receive ballot return envelope. <i>*Postmarked on or before Sept. 19.</i>
Oct. 19, 2023	Deadline to certify the election. <i>*Certification may occur on an earlier date.</i>

1. WHY IS THERE AN ELECTION ON SEPTEMBER 19, 2023?

This special vacancy election is to fill the vacant seat in Fallbrook Union High School District - Trustee Area One for the term ending in Dec. 2026.

2. WHO CAN VOTE IN THIS ELECTION?

Only registered voters residing in Fallbrook Union High School District - Trustee Area One are eligible to vote. If you're not sure whether you reside in Trustee Area One, you can look it up at sdvote.com.

3. WHERE CAN I FIND MY COUNTY VOTER INFORMATION PAMPHLET FOR THE SEPT. 19 ELECTION?

Voter Information Pamphlets start going out to registered voters residing in Trustee Area One on Aug. 11. Starting Aug. 10, you may also view your pamphlet online [here](#).

4. WILL I RECEIVE MY OFFICIAL BALLOT IN THE MAIL?

Every active registered voter residing in Trustee Area One will receive a ballot in the mail for the upcoming Sept. 19 special election. If you have kept your address information up to date with the Registrar's office, you should expect to receive yours the week of Aug. 20.

5. WHEN IS THE DEADLINE TO REGISTER TO VOTE IN THIS ELECTION?

Tuesday, Sept. 5 is the deadline to register to vote in this election. The Registrar's office will be closed on Sept. 4 in observance of Labor Day.

Remember - you need to complete a new registration form anytime you move, change your name, or change your political party preference. You can register online at sdvote.com.

Voter registration forms are also available at the Post Office, Department of Motor Vehicles, and library buildings, as well as various City Clerk offices and the Registrar of Voters office at 5600 Overland Ave, San Diego CA, 92123.

6. WHAT IF I MISSED THE DEADLINE TO REGISTER TO VOTE?

If you missed the Sept. 5 deadline, you may still conditionally register and vote provisionally up to and including Election Day, Sept. 19. To do that, you may visit the [San Diego County Registrar of Voters office](#). Once your voter registration is processed and determined to be eligible, your registration becomes active. Then, the provisional ballot you cast can be counted.

7. WHERE CAN I VOTE IN PERSON?

This is a vote by mail election only, there will be no vote centers assigned.

In person voting is available at the Registrar of Voters office starting Aug. 21, Monday – Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The Registrar's office will be closed weekends and on Sept. 4 in observance of Labor Day.

8. HOW CAN I RETURN MY VOTE-BY-MAIL BALLOT?

The Registrar's office asks you to vote early! Mark your selection in the comfort of your home, seal your completed ballot inside your security return envelope, sign your name and date the envelope, and return it promptly to a trusted source:

- Return it by mail so it is received well before Election Day.
 - [Find a U.S. Postal Service Collection Box \(Blue Box\) near you](#).
- Starting Aug. 22, return it to any of the Registrar's Official Ballot Drop Boxes.
 - A [locator map](#) and complete [list](#) of official ballot drop boxes can be found at sdvote.com.

Vote-by-Mail return envelopes must be postmarked on or before Election Day, Sept. 19 and received by the Registrar's office no later than Sept. 26 to be considered timely cast.
