NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that an election will be held on November 3, 2026, at which there will be submitted to the qualified electors of each district the following measures:

MEASURE – COUNTY OF SAN DIEGO

Shall the San Diego County Charter be amended to establish an Independent Ethics Commission, Independent Budget Analyst, Independent Program Auditor, confirmation of certain senior County leaders, and optional Board of Supervisors appointment of the Public Defender; increase term limits from two to three terms for the Board of Supervisors members; require public disclosure of spending and performance data; clarify non-interference provisions; and update terminology and structure?

MEASURE TO FUND SAN DIEGO COUNTY HEALTH & SAFETY SERVICES

To clean-up sewage pollution in Tijuana River Valley, improve wildfire prevention, emergency response, access to healthcare, food assistance, childhood development services, and authorized administrative expenses; shall the measure authorizing a half-cent sales tax raising an estimated \$400,000,000 to \$450,000,000 annually, requiring citizen oversight, public spending disclosure, and independent annual audits, and lasting until ended by voters, be adopted?

MEASURE – FALLBROOK UNION ELEMENTARY SCHOOL DISTRICT

To update local elementary and middle schools without increasing tax rates; replace failing roofs, plumbing and electrical systems; improve school safety; construct/repair/acquire classrooms, labs, facilities, equipment, and sites; and qualify for State matching funds; shall Fallbrook Union Elementary School District's measure be adopted, authorizing \$76,000,000 in bonds at legal rates, levying a projected \$30 per \$100,000 assessed value while bonds are outstanding, generating \$5,000,000 annually, with public oversight, audits, no funds for administrators, all funds staying local?

MEASURE – GROSSMONT-CUYAMACA COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT

Grossmont-Cuyamaca Community College District Fire Safety, Job Training, College Affordability, No Tax Rate Increase

With funds that cannot be taken by the State and spent elsewhere and NO tax rate increase, shall Grossmont-Cuyamaca Community College District's measure to

- improve/expand career training classrooms
- remove asbestos/mold
- reduce wildfire threats
- maintain college affordability

be adopted, authorizing \$624 million of bonds with legal rates, levies below \$25/\$100,000 assessed valuation while outstanding (\$45 million annually), audits, taxpayer oversight, full disclosure of all spending?

MEASURE – JAMUL-DULZURA UNION SCHOOL DISTRICT

With no projected increase in current tax rates and to repair/ replace deteriorating roofs, plumbing, dry rot, termite damage, electrical; upgrade aging schools to meet current health/ safety standards; and upgrade classrooms to support student achievement in math, science, technology, reading, writing, shall Jamul-Dulzura Union School District's measure be adopted authorizing \$18,000,000 in bonds at legal rates, levying \$30 per \$100,000 assessed value (averaging \$1,300,000 annually) while bonds are outstanding, with citizen oversight/ audits, all money locally controlled?

MEASURE – JULIAN UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT

To repair, modernize, and construct classrooms and career technology facilities for college/career readiness in agricultural science, chemistry, math, technology, and skilled trades; fix deteriorating facilities, roofs, plumbing/electrical systems; and improve school safety/security systems; shall Julian Union High School District's measure authorizing \$9,000,000 in bonds at legal rates be adopted, levying approximately \$30 per \$100,000 assessed value (averaging \$650,000) annually, while bonds are outstanding, with citizen oversight, independent audits, and all money locally-controlled?

MEASURE – LA MESA-SPRING VALLEY SCHOOL DISTRICT

La Mesa Spring Valley School District Classroom Repair & Upgrade Extension Measure. To repair/upgrade deteriorating roofs, plumbing, electrical systems; install air conditioning/shade structures to protect students from extreme heat; remove asbestos/lead pipes; and upgrade schools to current health/building safety/disability access standards, shall La Mesa Spring Valley School District's measure be adopted, authorizing \$131,000,000 in bonds at legal rates (without increasing current tax rates), levying \$22 per \$100,000 assessed value (\$9,000,000 annually) while bonds are outstanding, with independent oversight and audits?

MEASURE – MOUNTAIN EMPIRE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

To repair, replace, or reconstruct deteriorating classrooms, science labs, career technical education and school facilities at Mountain Empire High School that don't meet building safety/earthquake safety standards; remove asbestos, lead pipes, mold; and replace/fix roofs plumbing, sewer, electrical, and aging portables, shall Mountain Empire Unified School District's measure authorizing \$23,000,000 in bonds at legal rates be adopted, levying approximately \$38 per \$100,000 of assessed valuation (\$2,542,353 annually) while bonds are outstanding, with independent oversight, audits, and all money locally controlled?

MEASURE – SAN DIEGO UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

SAN DIEGO UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT REPAIR, STUDENT SAFETY, NO TAX RATE INCREASE MEASURE

To repair/upgrade all public schools, help retain/attract teachers by:

- Repairing deteriorating roofs, plumbing, restrooms;
- Providing safe drinking water;
- Removing asbestos, lead paint, mold;
- Upgrading outdated career/vocational, science, technology, engineering classrooms;

shall San Diego Unified School District's measure authorizing \$3,500,000,000 in bonds at legal rates, levying \$32 per \$100,000 of assessed value, providing \$204,000,000 annually while bonds are outstanding, requiring public spending disclosure, audits, citizens oversight, be adopted?

MEASURE - SANTEE SCHOOL DISTRICT

With funds that cannot be taken by the State and spent elsewhere, and no increase in tax rates, shall Santee Elementary School District's measure:

- repairing leaky roofs, plumbing, sewer systems
- updating inefficient heating, ventilation, air-conditioning systems
- building multipurpose instruction classrooms
- repairing aging schools, classrooms

be adopted authorizing \$30 million of bonds with legal rates, average levies below \$13 per \$100,000 of assessed valuation (\$2.2 million annually) while outstanding, audits, independent oversight, and full public disclosure of all spending?

MEASURE - VISTA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

Without increasing current tax rates, to repair and upgrade aging classrooms, science labs, school facilities, and instructional technology to support college/career readiness in math, science, technology, engineering, arts, and skilled trades and fix deteriorating roofs, plumbing, sewer, and electrical systems shall Vista Unified School District's measure be adopted authorizing \$543,000,000 in bonds at legal rates, levying \$58 per \$100,000 assessed value (\$31,000,000 annually) while bonds are outstanding, with citizen oversight, independent audits, and all money locally-controlled?

MEASURE - RAMONA MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT**AMENDMENT OF PROPOSITION 'NN' TO MODERNIZE THE ORDINANCE.**

Shall the voters of the Ramona Municipal Water District adopt a measure amending Proposition 'NN' by (1) exempting grant funding and donations from the calculation of authorized expenditure limit; (2) increasing the expenditure limit for new projects from \$1,000,000 to \$10,000,000 where no debt is incurred; and (3) establishing annual adjustments to the expenditure limit based on the San Diego Area Consumer Price Index beginning January 1, 2028?

MEASURE - PERMANENT ROAD DIVISION NO. 1000, ZONE NO. 9B – HARRIS ANNEX ("PRD Zone")

Shall the County of San Diego, beginning Fiscal Year 2027-28 and annually thereafter, levy a special tax of up to \$1,000 per developed / \$375 per undeveloped parcel within Permanent Road Division No. 1000, Zone No. 9B – Harris Annex, replacing the existing assessment? The tax may be adjusted by up to 5% annually based on the Los Angeles Construction Cost Index or a comparable Southern California index and remain until modified or dissolved by law.

MEASURE - PERMANENT ROAD DIVISION NO. 1000, ZONE NO. 13A – PALA MESA ZONE A ("PRD Zone")

Shall the County of San Diego, beginning Fiscal Year 2027-28 and annually thereafter, levy a special tax of up to \$1,786.00 per developed / \$893.00 per undeveloped parcel within Permanent Road Division No. 1000, Zone No. 13A – Pala Mesa Zone A, replacing the existing assessment? The tax may be adjusted by up to 5% annually based on the Los Angeles Construction Cost Index or a comparable Southern California index and remain until modified or dissolved by law.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that pursuant to the California Elections Code, the legislative body of said district, or any member or members thereof authorized by such body, or any individual voter or bonafide association of citizens of the district, or any combination of such voters and associations may file a written argument, not to exceed 300 words in length, for or against a measure. Said arguments shall be accompanied by the statement required by California Elections Code Sec. 9600.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that, based upon the time reasonably necessary to prepare and print the arguments and sample ballots and to permit the 10-day examination period for said election, the arguments must be received in the office of the Registrar of Voters, 5600 Overland Ave., San Diego, no later than 5:00 p.m., August 13, 2026. (Arguments may be changed or withdrawn until and including this date.)

Official election materials will be available for viewing at the Registrar of Voters Office in accordance with California Elections Code Sec. 9190, 9380, & 9509.

All Vote Centers will be open at 7 a.m. and close at 8 p.m. on Election Day. Ballots will be counted at the Registrar of Voters Office. For further information please visit sdvote.com or call the Registrar of Voters at 858-505-7260.
